


Important Broadband News

Hello EFR Residents,

I hope you don't mind if I give you more frequent Broadband Project updates for the next few weeks. It's because we are at a **critical point in time**. We have 4 more weeks to garner 287 more commitments to sign-up for high-speed internet. That's **72 commitments per week** throughout the month of June. Our goal is 350 commitments. As of today, we have 63.

Here's the breakdown of the 63 commitments:

- · 28 Elk Falls Ranch
- · 06 Mountain View Lakes
- · 02 S. Elk Creek Road
- 27 Woodside



This is going to be hard, but this is our test. Commitments, which include the \$500 installation fee, help us determine the *real interest* (demand) for this service. It is not a sustainable business model for <u>South Park Telephone</u> if enough demand isn't truly there. What this means is, if we can't get reasonably close to 350 commitments, we won't be able to apply for the grant. Even with the grant, South Park Telephone will still be investing a substantial amount of money (~\$1.5 million) in infrastructure. If they don't have enough customers, it will not make sense for them to make the investment.

Remember the **\$500** is fully refundable if we don't get enough commitments or do not get the grant.

We can use your help. Talk to people you know in the neighborhood. Remind them of the benefits. This is a great opportunity. If you sign-up up-front, the cost of installation is \$500 vs. \$2,000-\$3,000 for one-off installation. And you can take advantage of a discount on monthly rates.
